
Why am I on a DoLS authorisation?




An assessment was completed that showed you cannot consent to your care and treatment where you live.




They have found your care and treatment plan is in Best Interest, being proportionate, reasonable and justifiable (necessary) to support you.



The DoLS authorisation is there to protect your rights.




The DoLS Authorisation may include rules to help keep you safe.



If you can not make a decision then a Best Interest Decision is made with you, including your feelings, wishes and values, as well as speaking with your family.




